Involvement in national, regional and EU initiatives with individual CTC or with network of WBc CTCs, supported by EU partners

Depending on the type of beneficiaries, various marketing activities should be undertaken in accordance to Programme for dissemination and public awareness

Brockerage events will also serve as marketing and networking tool

2.3 Update existing systematization knowledge e-base with new topics



* At least <u>4</u> new lecturers/experts will be selected during this reporting period.

Selected experts will <u>systematize knowledge in the areas of multidisciplinary</u> <u>approach</u> in product and process development, bioengineering, marketing, industrial design, and other identified fields, providing VM applications in medicine, construction, agroindustry, pharmacy etc.

✤ At least <u>4</u> new topics in systematization knowledge base will be provided until the end of reporting period.

 UKG and UP will send names of experts and new topics to Project Coordinator until 15th November 2011.

✤ UKG will post these new materials into existing systematization of knowledge, available on web site.

Systematiozation of the knowledge will be moved to CTC web site, because CEVIP site is unstable (old version of PHP-NUKE from 2006).







3.2 Develop, assess and adopt the new regional model of cooperation



All WBC partners will participate in implementation of the new WBC Regional model of University-enterprise cooperation, that is following activities:

- Establishment Science and Technology parks in regional university centers
- Organization of WBC regional industrial clusters
- Forming **University-enterprises consortia** for joint projects;
- Establishment of Collaborative-training and/or long-life learning centres;
- Setting up of **Open Innovation Networks with SME**;
- **Practical placements** for students in industry;
- Industrial fellowship programme for graduates and/or employees from enterprises

For this activity, regional stakeholders should be involved: Universities in the WBC region, Academic and Research networks for SEE and WBC, Ministries of Education, Ministries of Science, Ministries of Economy, Chambers of Commerce, Agencies for SME development, National Employment Agencies and all the other political ar social partners.

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3.3 Set up joint structure of SMEs

Outcome leader UL

Support the establishment of joint structures of SMEs, as groups of small enterprises with similar sector, social and geographic profiles, in the form of Associations or Clusters (national and regional), with the support of national and regional authorities, university research centres, and funded from the national investment plan.

CTC centres will have central role in their <u>networking and grouping</u>, offering them wide set of trainings, R&D and technological services.

Also, CTC centres should join a existing regional clusters of SMEs, in order to get opportunity to offer their services, trainings and facilitate the commercialization of R&D results.







3.4 Case studies – benchmarking best practice



- Three case studies by UP, UR and UBL should be finished until the end of year.
- Topics and aims of case studies will be proposed by SMEs and CTCs until November 2011.
- CTCs managers will coordinate elaboration of case studies
- ✤ Available equipment of CTCs, new equipment and software procured within the project, expertise of EU partners, will be used in this activity realization
- Report on Case studies will be published, as printed and electronic version, for dissemination purposes.

- CTC UBL NC programming and the basics of CAM modelling (40 hours, XX participants), XX-XX 2011
- UKG will provide develop MOODLE platform for uploading instructional materials of vocational trainings for further e-Learning, until 1st December
- Teaching material for vocational trainings will be redesigned and prepared for setting up at MOODLE platform, by CTCs, until 31st December
- Setting up, maintenance and regular updating of e-material are activities, which will be constantly performed during the whole period.
- UKG will prepare login parameters to all CTCs, and User Guide for using Moodle platform, by 15th December 2011.
- For adminsitration and maintenance of e-Learning platform UKG will be responsible







5.3 Develop and conduct Industrial Fellowship Programme (IFP)

Outcome leader UPD

At least 30 industrial fellows will spend from 3 until 12 months at academic/research institutions in Serbia, Croatia, Bosnia&Herzegovina and Montenegro (time schedule should be flexible)

CTCs will coordinate IFP, whereat CTC Kragujevac will realize 13 IFP, CTC Rijeka 7 IFP, CTC Banja Luka 5 IFP and CTC Montenegro 5 IFP.

Implementation procedure should be flexible, in accordance with SMEs expectations and availability of felows

CTC managers can adapt Agreement to specific requirements of sponsor enterprise.

- ✤ UKG will send translated IFP anexes to UR, UBL and UP, until 1st November.
- Industrial fellows will prepare IFP reports for public dissemination at CTC web sites
- Databases will be available at CTC web sites, also (page DEMAND/SUPPL)

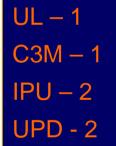




5.4 Develop and conduct Practical Placement Programme (PPP)

- It is necessary to prepare new Travel Plan, by 1st November in order to spend travel budget, with planned number and types of mobilities

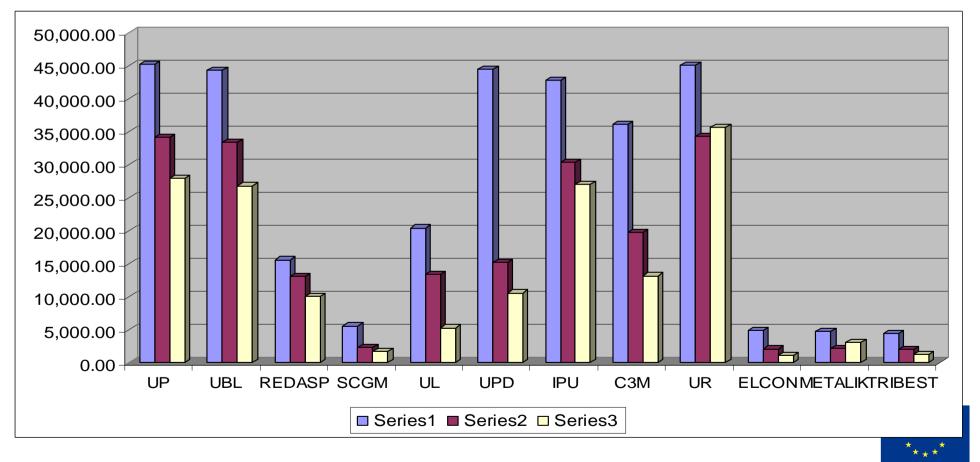

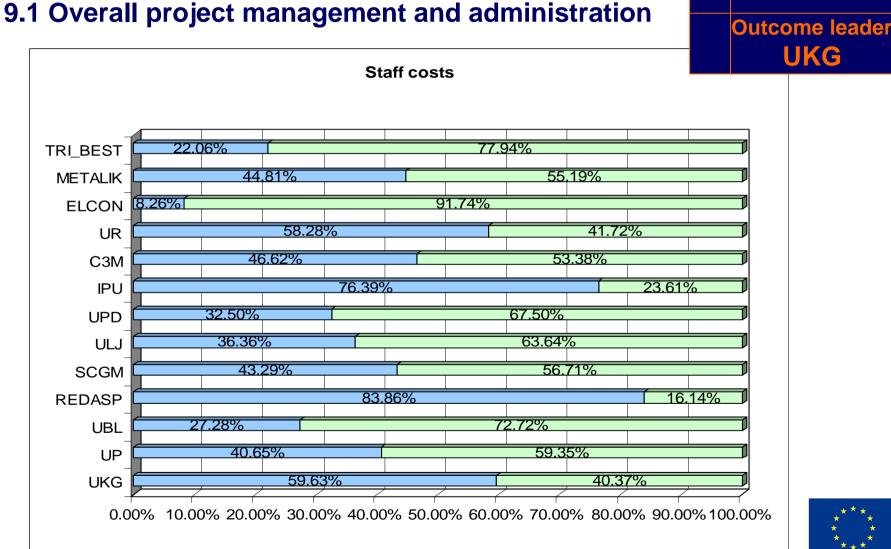

Outcome leader

Consolidated budget statistics (PP + UKG) has following distribution: 63.9% declared costs with completed supporting documents, 29.2% unspent TEMPUS grant, 69.9% of co-financing and pre-payment by PP and UKG

Coordinator and Site managers should envisage co-financing and 10% of prefinancing in this final year of the project implementation







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9.1 Overall project management and administration

- Outcome leade
- Application for extension of period of the project implementation DECISION of Steering Committee
- Reasons:
 - Extended activities with almost duplicated indicators (TSNA, publication, vocational trainings) and introduction of new ones (public debate)
 - Time-consuming procurement procedures for provision of equipment
 - Economic crisis influenced problems in IFP implementation
 - Practical Placement Programme in EU institutions (6 students)
 - Practical Placement Programme in PC institutions (4 students)
 - Industrial Fellowship Programme completion (30 fellows)
 - Realocation of unspent travel costs and new travel plan
 - Extended implementation period will provide CTCs with opportunity to offer broad range of services and trainings to SMEs in the region
